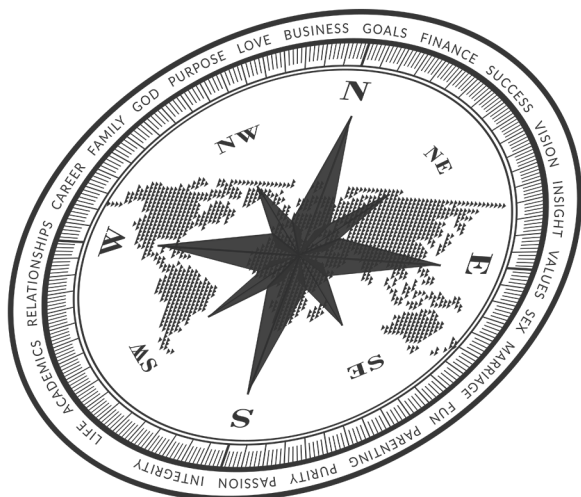

VALUE GOD'S VOICE OVER REPUTATION

Text: Hebrews 3:15 NIV

As has just been said: "Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as you did in the rebellion."

Some years ago, while still living with my parents, I was looking for the car key one morning. After a long search, I realized I had locked it in the car. I walked over to my Dad, explained the situation to him, and he gave me the spare key, but not without a warning not to be careless. I apologized.

But like a setup, the same incident repeated itself that week. Dad was aware, but I told him I would find the key. Now that I knew where the spare key was, I took it and returned it after I opened the car.

I thought it was a done deal, but the next day, Dad asked, "Temi, where did you see the key to the car yesterday?" In a split second, I have a blanket answer, "It was just lying somewhere." We both left for work.

As I sat in the office, the conviction of the Holy Spirit took over: "Did you just lie to your Dad?" I admitted my wrong. But the Holy Spirit was not done. He said, "Send a message to tell him the truth." "Ah, Holy Spirit, how would my dad see me? I just settled down to pastor full-time. Holy Spirit, I have admitted I am wrong already."

The room went quiet. I knew the Holy Spirit withdrew. I picked up my phone and sent a text apologizing for lying and I told him the truth. I had peace of mind immediately.

If you choose reputation over the correction of the Holy Spirit, you will not grow as a believer, and you will run into a lot of trouble eventually. Do not train your heart in disobedience. It is not wise.

That was the error of King Saul. He wanted public honour in his disobedience. He chose reputation over obedience:

1 Samuel 15:22, 30 NLT

[22] But Samuel replied, "What is more pleasing to the Lord: your burnt offerings and sacrifices or your obedience to his voice? Listen! Obedience is better than sacrifice, and submission is better than offering the fat of rams.

[30] Then Saul pleaded again, "I know I have sinned. But please, at least honour me before the elders of my people and before Israel by coming back with me so that I may worship the Lord your God."

Build character!

VALUE GOD'S VOICE ABOVE POSITION

Text: Romans 8:14 NKJV

For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.

About two years into ministry, I was teaching in a midweek service. I made a reference in scriptures about the women who showed Saul the way to Prophet Samuel's house and the volume of words that was used. A young man in church said, "They are all like that."

Without thinking twice, I clapped back, asking, "Does that include your mum and sister?" He said, "No." I "taught him a lesson" and continued teaching.

The next morning, as I went to the place of prayer, the Holy Spirit told me that I was wrong and I should apologize immediately to the young man. I called him and apologized. He said he was not offended. But it was about the Holy Ghost and me.

That Sunday, I told the church that I apologized for what happened on Tuesday. A young man walked up to me after service and said, "Thank you, sir, for apologizing. From today, you are my pastor." I was amazed.

Beloved, no matter the position you have attained, value the correction of the Holy Spirit above your position. If you are older but you are convicted by the Spirit about a matter, go and apologize for it.

My parents have walked into my room after midnight as a teenager before

to apologize about a matter. They are totally submitted to the Spirit. They walked in and realized that I had written on my wall, "It is better to live on the streets than live in a home where you are not appreciated." Then I added a note, "Today, Mum called me a lazy pig." I dated it and added time. How many children have been torn apart because parents did not respond to the prompt to make things right?

Be led by the Spirit.

Value that voice above position.

When you know you are wrong, it is integrity not to cover it up. Please, make things right. Simple things really matter.

Song of Solomon 2:15 NKJV

Catch us the foxes, the little foxes that spoil the vines, for our vines have tender grapes.

Just like the grapes, your heart must remain tender. Deal with the little foxes of pride or entitlement that can ruin your walk with God.

CONFESSION

I cut off little foxes from operating in my life. I am not led by the flesh. I am led by the Holy Spirit.



VALUE GOD'S VOICE ABOVE YOUR APPETITE

Text: Deuteronomy 21:20 NKJV

And they shall say to the elders of his city, 'This son of ours is stubborn and rebellious; he will not obey our voice; he is a glutton and a drunkard.'

I rewamiri made an amazing meal. I sat at the table and enjoyed the meal. Then, I asked for another helping, especially for the well-spiced meat. The moment she set it before me, I had a prompt not to eat it, but I did. The meal was too sweet to ignore.

I could not wake up at the right time that I would normally wake up. Even when I eventually woke up, I could not pray as I should. I was at the mercy of my stomach.

I remember the story of a father in the faith who said he was served a sumptuous meal. It was pounded yam. The Holy Spirit told him not to eat, but he ignored it because he did not want to disappoint his host. He ate it.

When he finished eating the meal, they rushed in to inform him that his sister needed prayers. She was in critical condition. At that moment, he knew why the Holy Spirit wanted him to stay light. He ran to the backyard and forced himself to vomit all he had eaten while repenting. He then went to pray for his sister. God's mercy intervened, and the tables turned.

Anyone God will use greatly will pass the test of food. Adam failed the "You shall not eat" test. He lost his place. David would have ruined his journey to kingship because Nabal refused to give him and his men provisions. Daniel and his

friends refused to defile themselves with the king's portion. The Israelites murmured about food and prolonged their stay in the wilderness. Do you remember the young prophet who returned to have a meal against the instructions of the Lord? The day he rose to prominence was the day he also perished. The last Adam, Jesus, was hungry but would not succumb to the temptation of turning stones into bread.

We are warned about our appetite. The book of Hebrews warned us clearly that we should not be like Esau:

Hebrews 12:16-17 NKJV

[16] lest there be any fornicator or profane person like Esau, who for one morsel of food sold his birthright. [17] For you know that afterwards, when he wanted to inherit the blessing, he was rejected, for he found no place for repentance, though he sought it diligently with tears.

Do not let food become the trap that hinders the fulfillment of your destiny. Cry to the Lord, Lord, help me!

DAY 04

“I WON’T LIE TO YOU”

Text: Ezekiel 24:14 (ESV)

I am the Lord. I have spoken; it shall come to pass; I will do it. I will not go back; I will not spare; I will not relent...

We were about to drive out for just some minutes when Olive ran to her mum saying, “I want to go with you”. She was not appropriately dressed. Her mum told her to go dress up. She ran inside with such speed to pick a dress and a pair of shoes.

While she dressed up, she heard the sound of the door and began to run and cry, thinking she had been left behind. I kept reassuring her that Mum was still around. At a point, Mum walked back in and said to her, “I am still here. I would not lie to you that I am waiting for you. Is that okay?” She nodded with a smile.

We looked at each other and smiled. Why? We remembered the days when older ones used the trick of “Go get your shoes” to leave us behind.

First, it may be a long time since you were asked, but are you ready to go with the Lord when He shall appear? Will you still be looking for something? Will you be like Jesse’s other sons, whom Samuel had to tell, “Go and sanctify yourself”? They needed notice, yet they were not chosen for kingship.

Or will you be like David, who came straight from the field and did not need to be told to get sanctified? He was living a sanctified life. He needed no emergency preparation. He was ready for the day of the Lord’s appointment for him in destiny. His daily living was sanctified living. It is better to live ready than just get ready.

A time is coming when there will be no room to make any adjustments. While the five virgins sought emergency oil, the

door was shut. We are urged to live “like men waiting”. Will you be ready when the Lord shall come?

Second, as you go out today, I want you to know that God will always keep his promise. He is your Father and He will never lie to you.

God is not like people. He tells no lies. He is not like humans. He doesn’t change his mind. When he says something, he does it. When he makes a promise, he keeps it.

Numbers 23:19 GW

You can count on the promise of God. It will come to pass. His Word is His bond. It is impossible for God to lie:

that by two immutable things, in which it was impossible for God to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us:

Hebrews 6:18 KJV

Do not let the situation derail you.

Do not let the challenges derail you.

Do not let the promise of alternative comfort outside of God’s plan derail you.

He cannot lie to you!

DAY 05

IF A MAN DOES NOT DISAPPOINT...

Text: Romans 3:4 NKJV

Certainly not! Indeed, let God be true but every man a liar...

When my colleague during the National Youth Service Corps got to know towards the end of our stay in Akwa Ibom State that the Lord would have me focus on ministry full-time, he made a very profound statement that keeps ringing in my mind- "Pastor Temi, please do not call me when there are small needs in the ministry. Please notify me when there is a huge need. That is what I want to be a part of".

Every time he sees a need to date (an amazing 12 years down the line), he is always eager to be a part of it.

First, are you always true to your words? Do you have the integrity of words? Some people simply go around saying things to make people feel good, but when reality hits, their words vanish like vapour and they are nowhere to be found. Be careful when you make vows and commitments.

There is a description that the Bible gives for the man who will ascend the hill of the Lord:

They always do what they promise, no matter how much it may cost.
Psalm 15:4 GNT

It is better if you keep quiet, especially when you know it will be difficult for you to keep your word. Many have made promises that they cannot keep:

Think before you speak, and don't make any rash promises to God. He is in heaven and you are on earth, so don't say any more than you have to. So when you make a promise to God, keep it as quickly as possible. He has no use for a fool. Do what you promise to do. Better not to promise at all than to make a promise and not keep it.
Ecclesiastes 5:2, 4-5 GNT

Do not make "political statements". Be a man of your word. Let people know that you have the integrity of your words. It is a good testimony.

Second, if a man can keep his word no matter how hard it is, how much more is the Lord God himself?

God honours His Word more than even his name. For the word of God will never fail.

(Luke 1:37 NLT). The Word of the Lord does not return to Him void:

"For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.

Isaiah 55:10-11 NKJV

Do not forget the powerful lines of this song:

You are Good, you are kind
You are more than these
I'm lost for words trying to describe you
Elohim, El-elyon, Aleselewi
Your Greatness is all I see
There is nothing you cannot do

There's no mountain you cannot move
If you have said it
Then you will do it
Cause You have a Track record
Of keeping Words
And you're not about
To stop doing it now...

God has a Track Record of Keeping His word.
Go and verify!

DAY 06

THERE ARE STILL GENUINE PROPHETS

Text: 2 Chronicles 20:20 NKJV

...Believe in the LORD your God, and you shall be established; believe His prophets, and you shall prosper.

When she finished leading worship in our convention years ago, the guest minister was about to preach. He paused and called her. He asked about her husband. Fortunately, he was in the meeting. He said to them, "I do not know you but thus says the Lord, 'In nine months, you will have your baby'.

They had been married for about 4 years and trusted God for a baby. That was in March. The baby boy landed the last week of December. It was exactly nine months.

Beloved, there are still genuine Prophets and the Gifts of the Spirit are still actively at work in our midst.

Men have abused spiritual things. There are fakes, I agree but the presence of the fake is proof that there is an original.

If you despise all spiritual gifts and you despise Spiritual offices because of the fakes you have encountered, you will shut yourself out of a certain dimension of God's redemptive plan for your life.

You will be a great Christian but there will be dimensions you will not enjoy. You will be content with normal life but supernatural dimensions will be closed in your life.

Why? How you perceive and receive Offices and Gifts comes with its reward.

He who receives a prophet in the name of a prophet shall receive a prophet's reward. And he who receives a righteous man in the name of a righteous man shall receive a righteous man's reward.

Matthew 10:41 NKJV

How then do I know the genuine and not get swindled by the fake? It is simple. Check the fruits and not just the gift. Jesus told us clearly:

"Beware of false prophets, who come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ravenous wolves. You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thornbushes or figs from thistles? Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. Therefore by their fruits, you will know them."

Matthew 7:15-18, 20 NKJV

What are the fruits to look out for?

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such, there is no law. Galatians 5:22-23 NKJV

Is he walking in love?

Is he controlled by greed?

Is he trying to sleep with me?

No genuine servant of the Lord would display fruits that are not of the spirit. Do not be carried away by gifts. Check for fruits.

I am not a victim of wrong prophecies and fake prophets. I am led by the Holy Spirit.



WINDOWS FOR ANSWERED PRAYERS

Text: Proverbs 11:24 NKJV

There is one who scatters, yet increases more; And there is one who withholds more than is right, But it leads to poverty.

A story shared stuck with me from my days in Uyo during my National Youth Service: It was said of a Christian brother who was a businessman and quite blessed. He had an amazing family. Unfortunately, he stood as a guarantor for someone who defaulted on some heavy transactions. He went from wealthy to struggling in weeks. Things went really badly. He sold almost all that he had. The only car he had left was in really bad shape.

He decided to take a retreat. He travelled to Lagos to spend time seeking the face of God. He was to fly back to base. It was the days when cellular phones were uncommon and the processes at the airport were not digital. There were always queues.

While he waited at the departure lounge, a man beside him from the Northern part of our country was making a call and ran out of airtime. He looked concerned. It seems the call was very important. There was no way he could walk out to get airtime and come back in to continue making his calls.

Out of kindness, the brother offered him his cellular phone. The man was shocked and grateful. He made all his calls and returned the phone. They got talking. The northerner was a manufacturer who needed the materials that the company of the man supplied. They struck a deal.

By the time the man was sharing the testimony of the turnaround, he said, "God has so blessed me that if my grandchildren decide not to work, we would still have money."

He was coming from a retreat where he prayed for a turnaround. What was the window that God opened for him? The opportunity to give.

Remember, when God answers our prayers, he opens to us windows of opportunity. One such window is the opportunity to give. What

if the man was not kind enough to give his phone?

Do you remember the story of David when he was trusting God for the restoration of all he lost also at Ziklag? He had prayed to God. They were already on the trail of the Amalekites.

His men spotted a man who was quite weak and abandoned to die on the way. They stopped and offered him a meal.

1 Samuel 30:12 NLT

They also gave him part of a fig cake and two clusters of raisins, for he hadn't had anything to eat or drink for three days and nights. Before long, his strength returned.

When his strength returned, he gave them all the intelligence needed to recover everything they had lost. They got it all and even much more.

When you have prayed, watch out for opportunities to give:

You may be trusting God for a scholarship worth thousands of dollars, and you have an opportunity to bless a child whose fees are just a few thousand in Naira. Be sensitive.

While we were building our church auditorium, we were also giving to other ministries doing the same or just starting out, once the Lord gives such opportunities.

When the window to give opens up, do not take it for granted. Be very sensitive.

I am sacrificial in giving. I am sensitive to a door of answered prayers. I am never stranded.

08

THREE THINGS THAT MAKE MEN BOW

Text: Revelations 21:7 NKJV

He who overcomes shall inherit all things, and I will be his God and he shall be My son.

The only money I had in the office that day was the church offering. It was the first few weeks after church started. I needed to help a friend make a call and I had no airtime. It was hard not to “borrow” from the money. It was also hard not to rationalize and take a little for airtime. My friend got offended and disappointed in me.

The very next day after that pressure to dip my hands into church funds, I got a call from a dear friend who mentioned that he would love to partner with the ministry monthly.

Friends, you will face situations that make men bow. You must not.

Ex. 20:5 says that “You shall not bow down to them nor serve them...” You may not be bowing to idols but are you bowing to pressure to compromise, pleasure and even persecution? What will make a generation that has seen the power of God like no other bow to another god? Same as what makes many seek other options than God:

1. **PRESSURE:** When men wait on God and for God and they feel God is not showing up, they bow to pressure. They settle for quick fixes. They try to help God. At a point on the journey of waiting, Abraham was also pressured into sleeping with Hagar while waiting for the promise. He ended up with something that troubled the promise.

2. **PLEASURE:** Pleasure has ruined more lives than persecution. Men seek to forget God when the journey is smooth.

Daniel said no to “defiling food”. Esau caved in. Joseph said No to “Free but costly sex”. Samson Caved in. Jesus said No to Devilish Wealth. Judas embraced it.

3. **PERSECUTION:** Some are threatened out of faith in God- loss of jobs, denial of funding, death threats etc. Paul went through many threats but stood for God. Shadrach, Meschach and Abednego refused to bow in Babylon. When persecution and pressure do not work, the devil tries a more subtle weapon, which is pleasure. When an external attempt fails, implosion can work. Balaam tried cursing Israel. When it failed, they turned to the weapon of seduction.

In the last days, the love of many will wax cold (Matt. 24:12). Is yours cold?

CONFESS I O N

I do not give room for pressure. I do not trade my destiny for pleasure. I overcome persecution.

DAY 09

YOU CANNOT EAT FROM THERE!

Text: Hebrews 6:12 NKJV

We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised.

As I stepped out of the room, I noticed that my daughter had dipped her hand inside a waste basket. She picked up a maize cob and was about to put it in her mouth when I saw her. I quickly grabbed it from her and said to her, "Olive, you cannot eat from there".

If you are well pastored, you cannot feed on junk. It is the assignment of teachers and fathers as delegated shepherds to ensure you lie down only in green pastures. A good shepherd will never allow the sheep to lie down and eat what will upset their stomach and hinder their growth.

If you see anyone whose life looks like a spiritual junkyard, you do not have to look far- such a person is far from teachers.

The writer of Hebrews gave an admonition that is a solid warning for us all on the journey of faith:

Remember your leaders, who spoke the word of God to you. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever. Do not be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings. Hebrews 13:7 -9a NIV

Your decisions in life become easy when you take your compass from the Word of God and the examples of your teachers in life and destiny.

When a member of the body is disconnected from the joints of the body, it brings pain to the body. A lot of those who transfer junks are disconnected

from the joint.

A teacher like Paul would teach and also stand as a model of what has been taught so he can say, "Follow me as I follow Christ". It is easier to say, "Do not eat what I don't eat" than to find a cure for poison.

A teacher is more than just an instructor. They are our compass when it comes to critical decisions in life. If you lose track of your teachers, you will be carried away by all kinds of strange teachings.

When you want to make critical decisions, do you remember any example based on God's Word that your teacher gave or that you have seen in his or her life? If you cannot, you are far from your teachers.

When you are far from your teachers, your decisions will look strange- it will show that it has a different spirit! Do not get carried away.

Or else, you will sit at the table with Jesus but you will be thinking of the words of the Pharisees and Sadducees. That is how Satan gets the room to operate through a man!

Retrace your steps. Do not get carried away!

DAY 10

ARE YOU A GREAT STEWARD OF RESOURCES?

Text: Mathew 13:12 NIV

Whoever has will be given more, and they will have an abundance. Whoever does not have, even what they have, will be taken from them.

We had a few days to go, yet there was still a lot to be done on the project site. The next phase needed quite some funds. We had to purchase things for electrical and plumbing accessories.

We all prayed and gave thanks before we left the site that night. By the time we returned in the morning, we had almost all the funds needed.

As I strolled on-site, still giving thanks, we received the exact amount needed to take care of the balance. Our joy was palpable. God showed up. Yes, He did.

But here is the amazing part: I sent a message to the person who sent the seed and the response still rings in my heart to date: "You are an amazing steward of God's resources". It challenged me heavily.

Beloved, God looks at your stewardship before He increases the resources around you. If you are not faithful to one man, you will not be faithful to a hundred men. If you are not faithful with one dollar, you cannot be faithful with one thousand dollars.

If you are a minister of the gospel (this will help a businessman or woman also), please separate the resources of the ministry from your resources. Do not mix it up. Let there be accountability over the resources of God's people. Please, even if the offering is two hundred and sixty-five naira and you knew you gave two hundred naira as a pastor, do not complain. Do not grumble. It is not your money. Treat it with honour. It belongs to God.

Apostle Paul made it clear that one of the requirements of a Kingdom Steward is faithfulness. You must be faithful!

Moreover, it is [essentially] required of stewards that a man should be found faithful [proving himself worthy of trust].

1 Corinthians 4:2 AMPC

There was a time when Apostle Paul had to administer the resources of God's people, we did not take things for granted. He ensured that a team of efficient and faithful men handled the funds and he gave his reasons:

And we are sending along with him the brother, who is praised by all the churches for his service to the gospel. What is more, he was chosen by the churches to accompany us as we carry the offering, which we administer to honour the Lord himself and to show our eagerness to help. We want to avoid any criticism of the way we administer this liberal gift. For we are taking pains to do what is right, not only in the eyes of the Lord but also in the eyes of man.

2 Corinthians 8:18-21 NIV

They did not handle God's money like their personal money. They did this for two reasons:

- To avoid criticism about how the funds were managed,
- To ensure that they do what is right before God and man.

There is a tendency to mismanage divine resources when you are not deliberate about stewardship and faithfulness. Please be deliberate.

CONFESSION

I am not wasteful. I am prudent in managing God's gifts. I am a good steward of resources.

DAY 11

ANYTHING IT TAKES FOR THE GOSPEL

Text: Romans 1:16 NKJV

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek.

Back in the day, while I was still an undergraduate, I would invite friends to join me in meetings in the land of Eruwa. At times, I was the host. At times, it was in my parents' church.

On one such occasion, I had the honour of hosting a friend. When we got to town, he had a necklace around his neck. Just before we stepped into the church, I spotted it. I pulled him aside and said, "My brother, I have nothing against your necklace but if you desire indeed to minister to this congregation, would you be kind enough to remove it so there is no restraint in their heart and the atmosphere as they observe you".

His response stuck with me. He said, "My brother sir, I am removing it right away. I will do anything for the gospel". He ministered powerfully and there was a free course for the Spirit of the Lord.

(This is not an argument for wearing or not wearing trousers, using jewellery, or any other matter like it. Our mindset when we were growing up was that attachment was made from the pit of hell. If a lady wears a pair of trousers, she is a prostitute trying to seduce men. Do you get the context now?)

There are times when you would have to sacrifice personal preference for the sake of the gospel. There are times when it is pure wisdom to know the culture of the community you are ministering to and make adjustments (as long as they are not sinful adjustments). You are doing it for Jesus!

One of the greatest hindrances to the move of the Spirit is the reign of the flesh. The flesh will always argue because of its tradition. Peter argued because he would never go near a gentile. God had to first work on his mindset before he could send him to Cornelius. I am sure Peter was concerned about his image as a high-ranking Apostle, but his love for Christ was bigger than the sentiments of his culture.

I have missionary friends who share experiences that take guts to go through for the Lord. If it is about self, the gospel of Christ

will be trapped in our holy huddles. Is it the water they drink or they bathe with? Is it the places they lay their heads? Yet God shows himself faithful. They return with a huge harvest of souls for the kingdom.

I have ministered in churches where there are certain rules and regulations – we remove our shoes before we get in, and some have both genders seated separately. We do not argue. We simply comply. May I not become a hindrance to the gospel of Christ.

It is not wise to say, "That is who I am. I cannot change for any reason. If they cannot accept me as I am, then I am not interested". Why would you let "self" hinder you from kingdom exploits? Do not let it happen.

Apostle Paul said, "Even though I am a free man with no master, I have become a slave to all people to bring many to Christ. When I was with the Jews, I lived like a Jew to bring the Jews to Christ. When I was with those who follow the Jewish law, I too lived under that law. Even though I am not subject to the law, I did this so I could bring to Christ those who are under the law. When I am with the Gentiles who do not follow the Jewish law, I too live apart from that law so I can bring them to Christ. But I do not ignore the law of God; I obey the law of Christ. When I am with those who are weak, I share their weakness, for I want to bring the weak to Christ. Yes, I try to find common ground with everyone, doing everything I can to save some. I do everything to spread the Good News and share in its blessings." 1 Corinthians 9:19-23 NLT

Do not become a sinner to save sinners. Find a common ground. Make sacrifices. Do it for Christ.

CONFESSION

I make sacrifices for the gospel. The gospel of Christ will not be mocked through me. I am kingdom-minded always.

DAY 12

WHAT I TOLD A POLICE OFFICER!

Text: Leviticus 6:12 NKJV

And the fire on the altar shall be kept burning on it; it shall not be put out...

In the early days of ministry, I was driving into town and I was already late for our evening service. I was stopped at a police checkpoint. When the policeman asked me to introduce myself and asked about what I do, I reasoned I would not be delayed if I said I am a lawyer. I introduced myself as a lawyer. The police officer was impressed definitely and asked me to go.

A few seconds later, the Holy Spirit asked me the same question again, "What do you do?" I knew I had messed up. I said, "I am a Pastor". He asked, "Why did you introduce yourself as a lawyer?" I repented but not without a silent conviction by the Holy Spirit telling me that "The call of God on my life was honourable"

Moses, a wanted man who committed a capital offence and went into exile, returned to Egypt, and the laws and the gods of the land could not place a finger on him. He kept walking in and out of the presence of Pharaoh and spoke as an advocate for others in the same courtroom that should be asking for his head.

Did it ever cross Pharaoh's mind to pick him up, try him and sentence him? He did not even need all that process. Pharaoh was the law of the land.

Moses went back as a man on assignment who had met with the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. The calling was his defence. If he had returned as a military man with swords and all, he would have been eaten alive.

Beloved, never joke with the honour and preservation of being loved, chosen, and called by God. It is backed by dignity and not shame. It is backed by grace.

Do you know that Aaron the High Priest did not die until the priestly robe was removed from him?

And Moses stripped Aaron of his [priestly] garments and put them on Eleazar his son. And Aaron died there on the mountain top; Numbers 20:28 AMPC

This year, do not joke with priesthood! You are a priest of the Most High God. Do you know what priesthood entails?

You must not joke with your God. Fear God. Priests do not joke with the one who called and appointed them. Do not take God for granted. Eli did. The consequence is better imagined.

You must not joke with the Altar. Fellowship must be consistent. It is a continuous affair. The altar must never be abandoned. The altar of a priest is never taken with levity.

You must not be found in profane things. To be saved, it was faith you needed. To remain usable and sendable as a priest, you need purity. Whoever calls on God will be saved but when it comes to vessels to use, God has a choice. He chooses.

Depart! Depart! Go out from there, touch no unclean thing; Go out from the midst of her, be clean, you who bear the vessels of the Lord. Isaiah 52:11 NKJV

As a priest, there are things that you must never be caught doing. They are forbidden to you.

Priests do not wear nonsense. God prescribed priestly garments for dignity and honour (Exodus 28:2). You cannot be splashing private parts in people's faces and keep shouting "To God be all the glory". Choose whose side you are on.

Priests are not the ones to spit vulgar words. Your words must be graceful. You do not have to sound profane to be relevant. Choose your words wisely.

From now on, take the compass of your life from your calling. It is dignifying. It has the covenant of protection therein. You are the redeemed of the Lord. Do not just say so. Act so. Talk so. Walk so. Dress so. Represent Jesus well!

CONFESSION

I do not joke with my Altar. My fellowship with God shall be consistent.



DAY 13

WHEN RESTING BECOMES DANGEROUS

Text: Psalm 13:3 KJV

Consider and hear me, O LORD my God: lighten mine eyes, lest I sleep the sleep of death.

There was a season when I thought I had worked a whole lot and I needed to take some rest. However, before I knew it, I was already moving from resting to indulgence. Devotion dropped. Sleeping increased. I was also getting lost in movies and social media. I kept saying, “I want to rest”.

Rest is great. Rest might be needed. However, you must know when rest becomes a trap for your spiritual growth, awareness and sensitivity.

David might have fought many battles and needed some deserved rest but the rest became a trap for his soul. That rest became the landmine for greater troubles.

“Late one afternoon, after his midday rest, David got out of bed and was walking on the roof of the palace. As he looked out over the city, he noticed a woman of unusual beauty taking a bath.” 2 Samuel 11:2 NLT

If your rest is leading you into trouble, you need to apply the brakes and get into reset mode.

You must know when rest is enough. Rest must not become spiritual slumber. When Sisera, a military commander, slept, he could be cheaply killed by a woman.

“But Jael, Heber’s wife, took a tent peg and seized a hammer in her hand, and went secretly to him and drove the peg into his temple, and it went through into the ground; for he was sound asleep and exhausted. So, he died.” Judges 4:21 NASB

Every sensitive spiritual soldier must know that the day after the battle is more sensitive than the day before the battle.

Peradventure, one thing that is worse than resting at the wrong time is resting in the wrong place. Samson’s rest was in Delilah’s bosom. It came with costly consequences.

You can rest from activities but never rest from your sensitivity. You can rest from activities but never rest from awareness. You can rest from serving tables but never rest from the ministry of the word and prayer.

CONFESSION

I do not find rest in the wrong spot. I am strengthened by the power of God.

HARD TIMES CAN BECOME SPRINGBOARDS

Text: Proverbs 24:11 NLT

If you falter in a time of trouble, how small is your strength!

In our secondary school days, we used a Mathematics textbook called the New General Mathematics. It was full of exercises. The unique thing was that it had answers on the last pages of the book. The reason for the answers was to confirm if the solution was right or wrong after the student must have practised.

But we had a different reason for it: we would always check it once the exercise became difficult. Then we tried to align our calculations with the solution. At one point, my friend's father sealed that part of the book. They were forced to work it out, and consequently became better mathematics students. For those of us who kept checking the back of the book for answers, we remained average mathematics students.

To make it more interesting, our teacher always knew the student who skipped the process. Why? The teacher did not just grade the answers; he graded the process.

Get this straight: God is not just interested in results. He is interested in the process that got the results. Moses got a result when he struck the rock and water flowed. Men must have hailed him but God failed him. Why? He used the wrong method. What made it the wrong method? It was not according to the instructions of God.

You must also understand this: Men who skip the process will never become exceptional. One of the terrible things that can happen to a man is to enter a new season and realise that there are lessons, training and resources needed in the new season but should have been picked in a previous season. That is

why most people get stranded.

Do not cheat. It is better to fail honourably while you keep a good name than you succeed without a sense of value or integrity. King Solomon said that a good name is better than gold or silver.

There is a time for everything. Life responds to principles. If you keep breaking principles, you will be out of shape in destiny. A lot of character deficiencies that the church gets to address are always failures of life lessons not picked or learnt in a domestic family.

If you do not learn self-control as a single person, you are an apprentice adulterer. A fornicating single will become an adulterous married man or woman. Discipline is not learnt in a hurry. Do not jump through processes in life.

Go through the moments that humble you. Learn the lessons. Failure can be a springboard or a grave point. It depends on how you respond to it. If you respond well, it can launch you to a new level with greater accuracy and better insight. If you respond poorly, life has a way of making you repeat the classes you failed. Life will not promote you on trial. Work your sums. Do not cheat! Honour process!

CONFESSION

*I endure during hard times. I honour process.
I am strengthened by the Lord.*

DAY 15

EXCITEMENT WITHOUT SENSITIVITY IS DANGEROUS

Text: Psalm 32:8 NLT

The LORD says, "I will guide you along the best pathway for your life. I will advise you and watch over you."

I was on the wheels about ten years ago, returning to Eruwa to catch up with a meeting. I must admit that I was moving faster than usual. As I was climbing uphill with some speed, I picked up a prompt from the Spirit of the Lord. I heard that still small voice saying, "Son, slow down". I felt it was strange but I obeyed without hesitating. I decelerated.

As I climbed uphill and was about to come downhill, I ran into a herd of cattle at the other end. If I were at top speed, it would have been hard to apply the brakes. I would have most likely run into the herd, or even if I made it into the layby away from the road, I would have headed into the bush. The still small voice of the Spirit of the Lord saved my life.

Beloved, speed without caution is dangerous. While praying for speed, remember the place of speed-breakers. Imagine your finest uncle gives you a fast-racing car as a birthday gift- the exact type you have always wanted. But he then announces to you that because you love speed, he asked the manufacturers that you would not need the brakes. Is that a gift or a death trap?

Speed without caution is a disaster. The desperation that does not listen to counsel may end up as a disaster. Do not be so excited about getting married that you do not answer the questions of sincere speed-breakers in your life- your close associates, your parents, and your pastors.

Build your sense of awareness. The Holy Spirit is not just about speaking in tongues; there is also such a powerful gift called discernment. You can train your perception to a point that it helps in making sensitive and even simple decisions.

Jesus Christ knew how important the ministry of the Spirit is in the life of the believer. He said to the disciples:

There is so much more I want to tell you, but you can't bear it now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak on his own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future. He will bring me glory by telling you whatever he receives from me.

John 16:12-14 NLT

The life of the believer is sweeter when he listens to the prompts of the Spirit. Let me ask you- Are there times that the inner witness and the still small voice of the Spirit has saved you from trouble? Think about it and give thanks today.

CONFESSION

I follow the leading of the Holy Ghost. I enjoy divine guidance.

DAY 16

THE FOCUS OF THE ASSIGNMENT

Text: Acts 20:28 NIV

Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood.

In my first year in full-time ministry, I asked my grandpa in the faith a simple question: "Sir, if you were to start ministry all over again, what would be your three major priorities?"

He responded with a question, "Son, are you trying to buy land now?" I told him, "No, sir". He asked another, "Are you trying to buy a new car?" Again, I responded in the negative. I wondered what was happening when he asked a third question, "Are you trying to build a church now?" I said, "No, sir."

He then answered me, "Son, if I am to start ministry all over again, my three major priorities will be: First, build the people. Second, build the people. Third, build the people". I am sure he saw my puzzled look. He added, "The people you build will return to buy the land, build a church and buy the cars. Just build the people".

Beloved, ministry is serving people in the name of the Lord. Ministry must be about obeying the one who has called you and impacting the lives you have been sent to.

The ministry of Jesus was also about impacting lives:

After this, Jesus travelled about from one town and village to another, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. The Twelve were with him, and also some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases: Mary (called Magdalene), from whom seven demons had come out; Luke 8:1-2 NIV

The lives that had been impacted became channels of blessing to Jesus and the ministry:

Joanna, the wife of Chuza, Herod's business manager; Susanna; and many others who were contributing from their own resources to support Jesus and his disciples. Luke 8:3 NLT

What impact are you making with your life? Thank God for your structured income (salary or business profits), but do you know that God can also bless you through other means?

There is an impact on income. There is a time when lives that your life and assignment have blessed return with a thank you. But the question is, "Who are you a blessing to?"

A believer who lives in the consciousness of divine assignment will not become a stylish beggar during festive seasons with a status update like, "It is my birthday, and no one is asking for my account number" or "This is Christmas and I have not seen you show the love of Christ to me."

If you take your assignment seriously, you will be surprised how God will bless you. Listen, the primary purpose of the assignment is to please the one who has sent you. However, the assignment has blessings attached to it.

No impact will mean no blessings.
Low impact will mean low blessings.
High impact will produce huge blessings.

God cannot be mocked. If you are lazy with the assignment, the field of the lazy also produces something- weeds.

Take your eyes off what people have. Focus on the work. Do not have a sense of entitlement. Do the work. Focus. Do not get offended because you blessed lives and they did not show appreciation; do more. It is a trap. Men cannot reward you. God rewards you if you do the work:

"And behold, I am coming quickly, and My reward is with Me, to give to everyone according to his work. Revelation 22:12 NKJV

Beloved, do the work. May we not lose our reward here on earth and in eternity. Grace.

CONFESSION

I focus on impacting lives. I am a blessing to all around me and to those God has given to me.



BEWARE OF WHAT CAN CORRUPT THE ASSIGNMENT

Text: Proverbs 4:23 NKJV

Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life.

In the second year of ministry, we were preparing for a meeting called Bold and Beautiful Conference. All hands were on deck the evening before the meeting.

When we were done in church, a beloved member who had a car decided to drop off those who lived some distance from the church. After they left, there were three of us left- A young man who lived beside the church, a young female student, and I.

I told the young lady that I would drop her off at home. She lived not too far from church but I was concerned that it was too late for her to walk in the dark alone. The young man just told me, "Good Night, Pastor".

The Holy Spirit stepped in, and wisdom instantly filled my soul. He said, "Why don't you go with the young man to drop off the lady? You can then drop the young man on your way home." What wisdom! I did exactly that.

Eruwa sleeps early. This was quite late into the night. The question is, "Was she a bad girl?" No! "Was I a terrible boy?" (Put no confidence in the flesh, but honestly, no). The next question is the real issue: "Can the devil sow a seed in a 30-second drive?" Yes! If he succeeds, he will return for the harvest.

What seeds can he sow?

First, he can sow a seed of lustful thoughts in any of our hearts. The scriptures say that the devil left Jesus for an opportune time.

When the devil had finished all this tempting, he left him until an opportune

time.

Luke 4:13 NIV

Never give the devil that opportunity. Do not give him a foothold. He will always go for more. By the way, the temptation of a Christian brother will likely be a Christian sister.

Second, he can sow a seed of a "bad name." In such a small town, if you see a pastor dropping off a girl alone late in the night, the devil can take advantage of such a scenario. That is when you will know the difference between "Pastor" and "Paaaaaaasssstttorr" with a sarcastic, emphatic tone.

Do not let indiscretion destroy the assignment before it takes off. Passionate and sincere people have been caught in strange demonic traps.

Listen to the voice of the Holy Spirit. Build principles that will safeguard your life and testimonies. When you look closely at men who have lasted for many years, you will see a lot of wisdom that has preserved them. Do not talk down on a man's consecration when you do not know what is at stake. There are heights that a man should never fall from. May the enemy not use us as trophies! Amen.

CONFESSION

I apply principles that guard my heart. I do not give room to the Devil. I operate in divine wisdom.

HANDLING EMOTIONS ON THE JOURNEY TO DESTINY FULFILMENT

Text: Romans 8:14 NIV

For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God.

My Grandfather in the faith shared a powerful lesson with us once: A dear friend of his visited him regularly in his city. Anytime he comes, they would jointly visit a senior minister of the gospel. After a while, they both noticed that when they visited this minister, they always returned discouraged. They never discussed it.

One day, as they drove to his place, he had a prompt that they should go back. He shook it off because he did not know how to tell his friend. Suddenly, his friend parked and said he was not going to visit the man.

He wanted to persuade his friend that it would seem somehow. His friend leaned to the passenger's side of the car, opened the door and told him, "If you still want to go, No problem. As for me, I turn back here". At that moment, he knew his friend was serious. They both returned to base. They are both great voices in the land today.

He told us that day, "When it comes to matters of destiny, be brutal".

Sentiments will hold you down in life and destiny. You need to wake up from the slumber of making choices that add no value to your God-approved journey.

Jesus was really hard on Peter when he suggested that the divine assignment he came to fulfil was not going to happen.

From that time on Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things at the hands of the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law and that he must be killed and

on the third day be raised to life. Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. "Never, Lord!" he said. "This shall never happen to you!" Jesus turned and said to Peter, "Get behind me, Satan! You are a stumbling block to me; you do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns." Matthew 16:21 – 23 NIV

Jesus told Peter he was a stumbling block and did not have the things of God in mind. Right after, Jesus gave a brief lecture to the disciples on the kind of commitment that following God's plan would need.

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it. Matthew 16:24-25

Those are some tough words. Very tough! Jesus ended up saying that whatever you gain that makes you lose your soul is not worth it- friendship, attention, public approval, money, status!

You cannot be sent if you are sentimental. Following God takes guts, grit and some gusto.

CONFESSION

I am not swayed by emotions in destiny choices. I choose the spirit's leading.

DAY 19

BROKEN PEOPLE DO NOT HAVE BROKEN HOMES

Text: Romans 12:10 NLT

Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honouring each other.

On a Sunday morning, Irewamiri and I had a disagreement. As we both passionately tried to make our points, we seemed to misunderstand each other. Knowing I had to get to church early, I went in to prepare.

After a few minutes, I told her I was heading to church and that I had left the car for her to use while I strolled until I found a commercial motorbike.

About a hundred metres away from the house, the Holy Spirit said to me, "Go back and hug her. Tell her you are sorry and that you love her".

I returned home immediately. I met her at the dining area, fixing breakfast for the children. I hugged her. I apologized. I told her that I love her.

If your ego is more important than the prompts of the Holy Spirit, you will destroy many things with your stubbornness. At times, that would include your marriage. Whatever two believers refer to as an irreconcilable difference is simply saying, "Our ego is more important than forgiveness", or at least one party is resisting the nudge of the spirit. Either way, ego is somewhere in the equation.

A broken husband and a broken wife can never have a broken home. When a home breaks, there is always an unbroken spouse. The sacrifice of God is a broken heart and not a broken marriage.

What does it mean to be a broken believer? It means to be fully yielded to the Word of the Lord and the instructions of the Holy Spirit, even when you have your right to fight for. Obeying God is more important than your personal preference.

There are many homes that the Lord would

have helped, but self and its twin, selfishness, have kicked out selflessness.

Self is promoted when personal altars of devotion and fellowship are neglected. If you no longer study the word and pray, 'self' will get fat. Your heart will be getting hardened. Little by little, the fence you are constructing to shut out the Holy Spirit and divine counsel will be completed. You should stop that construction work now. Abandon the site and demolish every imagination and thought that has exalted itself above the knowledge of God.

We demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God, and we take captive every thought to make it obedient to Christ.

2 Corinthians 10:5 NIV

A broken man knows that it is about obeying Christ. A broken woman knows that it is first about holiness and not happiness. Whatever makes you holy has the joy of the Lord in it.

Are you a broken husband?
Are you a broken wife?

Your answer determines a lot- Will it be a broken home?

Someone has to stand up and do the same thing I did. Go and hug your spouse. Apologize. Confess your love. Kick out ego. Begin afresh.

CONFESSION

My home is a godly model. I do not raise a broken home.



THE RIGHTEOUS MUST BE BOLD ABOUT THEIR VALUES

Text: Proverbs 28:1 NIV

The wicked flee though no one pursues, but the righteous are as bold as a lion.

Two of my dear Protégés had their pre-wedding photoshoot. It was quite a lovely one, but something rose in me when and where I saw them having a very intimate and seductive dance during the shoot.

I called them up and said, “What kind of dance is that?” They both said, “And our hearts did not agree with it. We just did it when the photographer requested we do”. I told them, “You should have resisted such a suggestion. It is your own wedding and your convictions and not that of the photographer”. They pulled down that part of their video shoot.

Friend, the righteous is as bold as a lion. Do not allow anyone to put you on the spot where they make you feel like you are “overdoing” things. The fact that it is popular does not mean it is right for you.

We are not called to tolerate sin. We are called to hate sin:

Love is to be sincere and active [the real thing—without guile and hypocrisy]. Hate what is evil [detest all ungodliness, do not tolerate wickedness]; hold on tightly to what is good.
Romans 12:9 AMP

You are not married until you are married. You cannot be sleeping in the same bed and room during courtship. Cohabitation is not Christ-like. You cannot be rubbing private parts in a video shoot; it is not Christ-like. Hate what is evil.

There must never be a hint of sexual

immorality among us:

But sexual immorality and all [moral] impurity [indecent, offensive behaviour] or greed must not even be hinted at among you, as is proper among saints [for as believers our way of life, whether in public or in private, reflects the validity of our faith]. Ephesians 5:3 AMP

An ambassador of Christ cannot and must never be an ambassador of lust. Let people call you names but it is better to stand with Christ.

When anyone under the guise of a profession suggests immorality to you, do not be afraid. You are righteous. The righteous are as bold as a lion. Respond boldly. Take a stand for your faith and conviction in Christ.

CONFESSION

I will not compromise godliness. I am an ambassador for Christ. I am full of boldness.

DAY 21

FIGHT LOOSENESS

Text: Proverbs 13:4 NLT

Lazy people want much but get little, but those who work hard will prosper.

He walked up to me after service and said, “Pastor, I want to quit my training as an apprentice”. He went on to mention certain challenges that he was facing. He wanted to quit for those reasons.

I smiled and told him, “You are not going to quit. You have what it takes to endure till the end. If you look back, you will notice a pattern. Do you know it is not the first time you would stop a great venture halfway?” He took a deep breath.

Then I added, “Please, I am sorry to tell you this: Do you notice that your dad quit many things? If you do not fight this pattern with all you have got, you will repeat his mistakes.”

He took heed. He pushed. He not only finished his training, but he has gone ahead to greater things that will change his story and that of his lineage forever.

One of the ways that the devil defeats a man is through the spirit of discouragement. Discouragement at times will disguise itself as legitimate excuses, but if you look deeply and with insight, you will see that there is a spirit that you must rebuke so it does not alter your journey in life.

One key thing that having a shepherd does for you is to take you far from want, and restore your soul when you are down and discouraged, while emphasizing the place of righteousness in decision-making. At other times, he will be there when you slide into poor decisions as a rod of correction and comfort. But the aim is to get you to that place the Lord has prepared for you.

A disciple must be disciplined. A disciple must be able to endure. A disciple must be able to discern when the devil wants to use weariness to introduce a strange pattern into his life. He fights back.

Can you imagine if the young man had no pastor? He would have made a personal

decision that has a great generational consequence.

There is a spirit of looseness in our times that you must fight. There are loose mouths that will speak anyhow. There are loose minds that will take all sorts of junk. There are loose clothes that show a lost state.

Beloved, you are either being harnessed by the Lord Jesus for kingdom purposes or you are being harvested by the devil as an ambassador of his schemes. There is no in-between.

Well! If you say you are neutral, let me announce to you that it is possible to be the devil's tool in God's house. Doeg the Edomite was in the presence of the Lord, but he returned to kill priests and their entire family members. There is no neutrality. Neutrality means “I am for the devil”. Will you go to war with a soldier who says, “I am neutral”? Neutrality is choosing the enemy side.

Being tied to the kingdom grants you ease in decision-making. You will talk like a kingdom citizen, and you will dress like one also. “Let your will be done on earth” will not be lip service, but your heart will be there.

Do not give up.
Be a disciple.
Use all the Lord has provided.
Fight looseness!

DAY 22

HOW COPYING CAN LEAD TO LESS

Text: 2 Corinthians 10:12 NKJV

For we dare not class ourselves or compare ourselves with those who commend themselves. But they, measuring themselves by themselves, and comparing themselves among themselves, are not wise.

Some time ago, we were in an appraisal meeting in the ministry, looking circumspectly at the vision and things that have driven it this far. We concluded that there were things we lost because we wanted to copy something else. We concluded that “We must be secure in our model”.

One of the things you must pray for in life is the grace to be secure with the revelations (insight, ideas and concepts) that God has given you the privilege to host and implement.

Pressure can make you leave what has been working for you to copy what is working for someone else. At times, the motive is sincere, but the loss, in the long run, is an adulterated version of what God gave to you.

Joshua learnt from Moses. Moses handed over to Joshua. Moses led the people to cross the Red Sea. Joshua led the people to cross the Jordan. Both did it in the instructed way. They waited for instructions.

There are times you will do exactly as another. Elisha parted the Jordan just like Elijah did with the cloak. However, there are times you will do it differently.

A discerning man would therefore spend time in fellowship with God per time to draw the method heaven has placed a seal on for the moment.

What opened up for Israel may bury Egypt. You must not be in a hurry to copy.

It is good to be challenged by others but it is better to be led by the Lord.

Maybe the giving of Barnabas challenged Ananias and Sapphira but they got themselves into a mess by attempting to do the same at the level of Barnabas. Do not kill yourself while trying to copy someone else. You may end up less than God intended.

Remember, those who compare themselves to themselves are not wise. Press in for divine inspiration. Even if it makes no sense, stick to the plan heaven has sown in your mind.

If you copy without the revelation behind it, it can lead to disgrace- the sons of Sceva can explain better! They saw firsthand what happens to those who copy without a mandate from God.

Be secure!

DADDY'S SLAP AND THE BITTER PILLS

Text: Psalm 141:5 NIV

Let a righteous man strike me—that is a kindness; let him rebuke me—that is oil on my head. My head will not refuse it, for my prayer will still be against the deeds of evildoers.

We returned from the clinic with a large quantity of medicine. One thing I hated was medicine; just the scent of it would make me vomit. Medicine had to be taken in sweet drinks (even then it was by force) or hidden inside yam flour (amala).

As we sat at the table that evening, it was time for the evening dose. I kept looking at the medicine and shaking as I lifted and dropped it. I repeated that action as my mother encouraged me. Father was simply watching.

After some time-wasting (spitting out the medicine), I noticed a fatherly slap land on my face. No one told me to swallow the medicine again. Father knew it was for my good! (I guess I recovered before taking the medicine.)

Listen, men who are meant to help you to fulfil destiny are not called to massage your ego and play the “nice” game.

Imagine how Peter felt when Jesus said, “Get thee behind me, devil”. Just imagine that was your Pastor or Spiritual Father or Mentor. Or “I chose the 12 of you and one of you is a devil” (Bombshell. We leave this wicked leader. Is that it?)

If you are flattered rather than fathered, you will burst as fast as you swell. If you love to hang around those who massage your ego, your destiny is at stake.

Correction helps your destiny. If you have not been corrected for a while by the people you regard in your life, you

may need to ask them for a review. This will help you confirm if they have not simply abandoned you to your patterns and decisions.

If you do not go through the comforting of the Rod and the Staff of the Shepherd, you will not get to sit at the table of delicacies that have been prepared before you!

Love Correction. Embrace Rebuke. The things that you need to be all God wants you to be could be “bitter pills”.

When next you have people who “slap you on the face” when you refuse to swallow the drugs that you need for health, say thank you! Do not walk away. You need such men!

DAY 24

THE FINAL QUESTION

Text: Acts 6:3 NKJV

Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business.

A pastor narrated a unique experience once: A young man who used to work in their ministry office got an appointment with a financial institution. The financial institution sent a reference form to the ministry office that they had to fill out and attest to.

After answering all questions, the final question was, “If you get a chance to employ him again, would you?”

That was a powerful final question. You either had to lie or you simply tell them the truth. If you say things like “it depends”, you have wrecked the chances of the young man.

What is the lesson there?

First, character counts. Joseph went through intense tests of character:

“Until the time came to fulfil his dreams, the Lord tested Joseph’s character.”
Psalms 105:19 NLT

One of the sterling records in scripture about Joseph states thus:

So, Potiphar gave Joseph complete administrative responsibility over everything he owned. With Joseph there, he didn’t worry about a thing—except what kind of food to eat! Joseph was a very handsome and well-built young man
Genesis 39:6 NLT

Second, you would be tested with small things. You will be tested with another man’s thing or things that are not your own. A lot of people keep failing character tests.

Third, God is looking out for men of Character and not just men of charisma. God knows when you speak, people develop goosebumps but He also knows that you cannot take your eyes off things that are not yours. He knows that you exaggerate your testimonies. He knows that you borrow things but never return them. He knows you make promises that you do not intend to keep.

Character defects will always put limits on a man. Men cannot trust you with resources and God cannot trust you with assignments.

What do you have to deal with now? Do not use giftedness to cover the cracks. Talent can take you to the top but only character will keep you there.

DAY 25

“I WANT TO BECOME A DOCTOR”

Text: Proverbs 22:6 AMP

Train up a child in the way he should go [teaching him to seek God's wisdom and will for his abilities and talents], Even when he is old he will not depart from it.

In my younger days, if anyone asked about what I wanted to become, I had no hesitation in saying, “I wanted to become a Medical Doctor”. I grew up seeing our neighbour practise medicine in an inspiring way. His son, I, and another childhood friend started observing medical procedures at a very young age - we were less than ten years.

I progressed into the sciences until my third term in Senior School Two when I ported to the Arts. The Doctor never said a word but his presence, drive, and results inspired a young boy. Today, I am not a Medical Doctor but his work ethic and visionary living are still an inspiration.

Let's begin with parents – Be careful who and what you expose your children to. There are devices to capture the hearts of children (the next generation) heavily deployed right now. You must be very sensitive.

It had been like that from the days of Jesus:

Then they brought him to Him. And when he saw Him, immediately the spirit convulsed him, and he fell on the ground and wallowed, foaming at the mouth. So he asked his father, “How long has this been happening to him?” And he said, “From childhood.” Mark 9:20-21 NKJV

You cannot keep watching and listening to things that do not edify while you tell them, “This is for adults”. If it is not healthy for your children, do not watch it at all. Fast some movies for the sake of their sanity.

Before you choose an event to attend, ask yourself if it will be healthy for your children.

Before you choose a restaurant to eat at, confirm if it will be a healthy space for the next generation. You are a trustee. Do not misbehave. Do not be in a hurry to turn them into adults.

Well! You need to remember that you are also a child of God. Most likely, if it is not good or healthy for a child, it is not healthy for a child of God.

Friends, there is nothing that you are exposed to that is neutral. You are being influenced actively daily. You only have a choice to choose who and what gets access to your life.

Solomon warned us to guard our hearts with all diligence because it is the spring of the issues of life.

Amnon gave his ears to Jonadab and lost his mind. He raped his sister and was murdered by his brother. What a mess.

Who has your ears?

Do not partner with strange forces to raise your seed like a Christmas chicken for slaughter. Do not feed them with things that prepare them to become ready tools for depravity. Feed them for preservation, posterity, and godly purposes.

My children will live for Christ. My seeds are preserved for Godly purposes.

DAY
26

“DON'T BRING THAT SICKNESS IN HERE”

Text: Genesis 18:19 KJV

For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment...

As children, anytime we got sick at school, our parents were called. As soon as we arrived home, Mother would say, “Temi, you know sickness is not permitted in this house. So before you come inside, rebuke that sickness.” You should have seen me saying, “In Jesus’ name, I am not sick.” She would definitely take great care of us and take us for medical treatment. I hated injections.

There was a time Mum returned from a conference and all three of us were sick. She came into the children’s room that evening and I heard her say, “Devil, you have no space here. I rebuke you, spirit of infirmity. Get out”. Our health was restored that night.

Today, we do not just pray for our children but we also pray for our parents. We now remind them of that strong faith in their ageing years.

There is something about seeing a great example of faith. It gives you a head start in life and destiny. Timothy had such a head start. He saw faith as a young child and faith was seen in him also.

“...when I call to remembrance the genuine faith that is in you, which dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice, and I am persuaded is in you also”
II Timothy 1:5 NKJV

Generational examples build you up for generational impact. It is easier to replicate what you have seen. But if it has not been seen, it is hard to replicate.

Unfortunately, the examples some saw were terrible and that is what they are also replicating. At times in the Chronicle of Kings, you will see words like this:

He did evil in the sight of the Lord and walked in the way of Jeroboam, and in his sin by which he had made Israel sin.
I Kings 15:34 NKJV

And he did evil in the sight of the Lord and followed the sins of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who had made Israel sin. He did not depart from them.
II Kings 13:2 NKJV

But we had the chronicles of those who followed great examples also:

And he did what was right in the sight of the Lord, yet not like his father David; he did everything as his father Joash had done.
II Kings 14:3 NKJV

Examples are powerful.
Be a great example.

Follow great examples.

“I AM SORRY, THAT DAY CAN’T WORK”

Text: Joshua 24:15 NLT

...But as for me and my family, we will serve the LORD.

We all sat at the table, and I told Irewamiri that I would still need to step out that Sunday evening. She looked at me and said, “I don’t know about that, dear. Sunday evenings are for us as a family”.

I called the person I had an appointment with and requested that we talk on the phone briefly. Many times, I have to say to people, “I am sorry, that day cannot work”.

No matter how busy you are, do not joke with the time created for your family. If you have none, create one. Your days must not be filled with all work and no time for your spouse and children. Soon enough, you will realise that they are all you have got. They are the motivation for most of what you do. Do not take them for granted.

I read an amazing story about Jonathan Edwards. The preacher of the classic, “Sinners in the Hand of an Angry God”. Despite his work as a preacher, he had a strong family moment. He spends his evening with his wife and eleven children. He lays hands on each of them and prays for them daily.

Almost two hundred years after A.E. Winship, an American Author, researched his lineage, his discovery was amazing.

In his published study, Juke-Edwards: A study in Education and Heredity, Winship revealed that the one marriage of Edwards produced an amazing lineage, including Two Hundred and Eighty-Five College Graduates on the Edwards family tree. The Edwards lineage produced:

1. Three Hundred Preachers
2. Thirteen notable Authors
3. Thirteen college Presidents
4. Sixty-five college Professors
5. One hundred Lawyers and a Dean of a law school
6. Thirty Judges
7. Fifty-six physicians (doctors) and a Dean of medical school
8. Eighty holders of public office
9. Three United States senators
10. One Vice President of the United States
11. One Comptroller of the United States Treasury.

(Culled from Purging Your House, Pruning Your Family Tree by Perry Stone)

What was it that Jonathan Edwards planted? He gave his home attention. He did not joke with his family. He planted the seed of love, faith and hope. What a lineage.

When last did you lay hands on your children to pray for them? What takes your family time? Is it just TV shows? What lasting kingdom impact are you leaving on your seeds? What adjustment will you make?

What day will you say to others, “I am sorry, that day cannot work, I will be with my family?”

28

COMMUNICATE TO BUILD YOUR MARRIAGE, NOT BREAK IT

Text: Colossians 4:6 NLT

Let your conversation be gracious and attractive so that you will have the right response for everyone.

Some time ago, I was away for a week-long meeting. The day I arrived was such a huge moment with Irewamiri and the children. Some hours later, I got an email from my wife. I was surprised. I read through it, and it highlighted the areas that she was grateful for in our marriage journey.

She spoke about how great a husband I had been, and I was blushing while reading the mail. At the end of the mail, she highlighted areas that she wanted us to work on as a couple.

It was tough reading through the loving “knocks and kicks.” It was easier to take in because I had highlighted some of the areas in self-appraisal a few days earlier.

Dear husband/wife, one person who will see your weak spot is your spouse. You must be willing to listen to your spouse. They may say it in words and a tone you do not like; pick the good intention behind their concerns and decide to adjust accordingly.

It can be tough accepting some feedback, but even when you fail by reacting wrongly initially, be quick to apologize for reacting negatively, while you then seek to understand what is being said. It will help you both to communicate better.

Feedback must be given in love and proactively. There are things you should overlook till you find the right time to talk about it or a moment when you can talk about it without the tone of anger or sentiments. You must remember that it is first about your husband or wife. Do not let issues kill the warmth. Love each other as you talk through the issues.

The rule is that you are either responding or reacting. If you bottle up issues, you will react. If you want to spill it out spontaneously, you will also react. Know what you overlook. Find the right time and atmosphere for a

conversation and build a strong relationship with your words and warmth.

It will look and seem hard at the start, but keep learning. Be quick to apologize when you are wrong. Dear husband, do not let pride and ego kill the warmth in your home. Beloved wife, stop bottling up issues till you explode.

What will help improve communication and reduce offences? You need to master what I will call ‘the principle of intent and interpretation.’

There is no God-fearing spouse who would want to hurt you with their words and actions intentionally. There are times that emotions will take over, and they may spill over with words like, “Do you even care?”, “Leave me alone. I don’t want to see you,” or even “You frustrate my life.” Words can tear into the soul and wreak much havoc.

Also, forgiveness will be hard when a library of hurting words and moments has been built. You will realize that you interpret even loving actions in the light of your hurts and offences.

Words are powerful building tools. Words can construct or destroy! Choose what it will do in your marriage.

Do you know you can ask God to bless you with the right words?

“And pray for me, too. Ask God to give me the right words...”
Ephesians 6:19a NLT

I use the right words in my marriage. I communicate gracious words to my spouse. My marriage is blessed.

DAY
29

DEAR PARENTS, WHAT ARE YOU PASSING ON?

Text: Psalm 112:2 NIV

Their children will be mighty in the land; the generation of the upright will be blessed.

My first time away from home was when I got admitted to a State University in my mid-teen years. One day, I fell ill. Unfortunately, I was the only one around in my flat. As my temperature rose, I got scared. It was late in the night. But I remembered how my Mum never permitted sickness under her nose.

There was a time she returned from a conference, and we were all not feeling fine. She walked into our room and announced that sickness should pack its load. We were all on our feet that evening.

As my memory was refreshed, I began to say under my breath, "Lord that my mother calls on, heal me." Miraculously, my temperature began to drop. I slept off and woke up better the next day. I still travelled, though, for a medical check-up. That night, however, left an imprint on my soul.

Dear parents, I want to ask you, what treasures are you keeping in the heart of your seeds? What handle do they have for stormy days? When you are not there, do they have an understanding of the Lord to cry out to Him? Can they withstand the devil and his fiery darts because they have an example in you?

Abraham had a great testimony from the Lord:

For I have known him, in order that he may command his children and his household after him, that they keep the way of the Lord, to do righteousness and justice, that the Lord may bring to Abraham what He has spoken to him." Genesis 18:19 NKJV

Abraham was a trainer. He had 318 trained servants who were born in his house.

Now, when Abram heard that his brother was taken captive, he armed his three hundred and eighteen trained servants who were born in his own house and went in pursuit as far as Dan. Genesis 14:14 NKJV

One of their training modules must have been on how to call upon God when Abraham was not there, or at least, they observed Abraham and saw that prayer was indeed very important.

And he said, O LORD God of my master Abraham, I pray thee, send me good speed this day, and shew kindness unto my master Abraham. Genesis 24:12 KJV

He had a handle on prayer. Do your children see you pray? Do you teach them to pray? Can they pray?

Another example is Joseph in Egypt. Joseph, in the middle of pressure, was able to withstand that temptation. He was far from home, but home was still reflected in his conduct and decisions. He still had a grip on faith and a pure walk in a very tempting environment. He stood out, and the environment succumbed to him.

What are you wiring into your seed?

You are writing an unwritten program with your life decisions. Your seed is already responding to it.

Show the next generation the way so they will not derail. Pay the price it takes to ensure they do not stray. Leave handles so life will not become difficult. Leave the keys so they can access the instructions that preserve. Leave wisdom so their decisions do not eventually leave you with worries and pain.

I pass on the legacy of righteousness, godliness and excellence to my children. My children will serve the Lord.



GODLY PRINCIPLES FOR MARITAL BONDING (1)

Text: Genesis 26:2, 6 NKJV

Then the LORD appeared to him and said: "Do not go down to Egypt; live in the land of which I shall tell you...So Isaac dwelt in Gerar.

A few months before marriage, while sitting at the table with our grandfather in the faith, he looked at us and said, "God is not an author of confusion. Nothing must come between your wife and yourself, not even the calling. God cannot call you to Eruwa and send your wife to England. That is not his way of doing things."

He went ahead and gave us instances of marriages that fell into the pit of confusion. They are either struggling, separated or totally dead marriages today.

This can look like a hard saying, but listen carefully: If you do not agree on where to settle, you are not ready to settle.

I had to let go of a relationship heading to marriage because we could not agree on location. I am grateful I did because we are both at peace in our different marriages today. It would have been a storm.

I heard a beloved woman of God say to ministers once, "This pattern of sending your spouse to pastor in London while you are in Lagos is strange. It is not God's model." She is right! Even if you are not a pastor, a home needs both the man and the woman. That is divine wisdom. We cannot be smarter than the Holy Ghost.

When Abraham moved, Sarah did not stay behind. Sarah also moved. Sarah dwelt in tents with Abraham on his journey of faith. Marriage is a covenant relationship. Covenants are bloody. You will at times need to sacrifice comfort.

We may not always say it- One area where Moses had his shortcoming was his marriage. His wife did not accept the call to Egypt. Moses eventually married an Ethiopian woman, who raised some dust. Moses was also the one who permitted divorce.

Listen- there are many patterns but ONLY the one ordained by the Lord will give you peace of mind, guarantee progress and preserve posterity.

The first principle of marital bonding is simple- God is NOT the author of confusion.

I Corinthians 14:33 NKJV

For God is not the author of confusion but of peace...

CONFESSION

My spouse and I are led by the Lord. We do not settle in the wrong locations. We settle in covenant places.



GODLY PRINCIPLES FOR MARITAL BONDING (2)

Text: Psalm 37:3 NLT

Trust in the LORD and do good. Then you will live safely in the land and prosper.

Someone reached out and asked me a simple question: My husband and children have relocated. I am the only one left in the country. I have a great job here, and I am not too sure I want to relocate. I have been praying to confirm if the Lord wants me to relocate. I have not really heard from the Lord. What should I do?

At another time, it was the man who was left in the country. He had relocated his wife and his children. He also had similar concerns. He was also praying about it. He also wanted to know what he should do.

Beloved, anytime there is confusion in a marriage, the problem is never far-fetched. We know that God is not an author of confusion. So, when there is confusion in any marriage, either both parties are not heeding the Lord, or one person is not heeding the Lord.

Let us simplify it, do not waste time trying to pray over what the Lord has spoken about expressly in His word. It would be sheer hypocrisy. There are things the Word of the Lord is very clear about. One of them is the place of oneness in marriage.

There is something called leaving to cleave: Genesis 2:24 KJV

[24] Therefore shall a man leave his father and his mother, and shall cleave unto his wife: and they shall be one flesh.

What does 'cleaving' mean in the Word of God? It means to cling, abide fast together and to follow.

Second, whenever there are issues of bonding and staying together as one in a place, it

would always be about the unwillingness of man.

Genesis 24:5 NIV

The servant asked him, "What if the woman is unwilling to come back with me to this land? Shall I then take your son back to the country you came from?"

It would be either one or both parties that are unwilling.

What was Abraham's response to this question?

Genesis 24:6, 8 NIV

"Make sure that you do not take my son back there," Abraham said.

If the woman is unwilling to come back with you, then you will be released from this oath of mine. Only do not take my son back there."

Matters like this are best sorted in courtship. If you wait till after marriage to have these conversations, you are already late.

God wants you and your spouse to be one. Your reasons for living apart may seem genuine, but would you trust the Lord and follow His Word fully? That strain in your union fades away when you follow the Word with meekness, and you let go of the unwillingness.

May your marriage stand!
